The East End of Fremantle is an area currently undergoing rapid gentrification. At the centre of this changing landscape sits St Patrick's Community Support Centre (St Pat's), an NGO who for the past 40 years has supported those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

*No Fixed Address* explores survival tactics, social rituals and ways of moving within and occupying public space as strategies to subvert environmental and economic precarity.

Unfolding as a series of workshops, public events, installations, film works and an exhibition at DADAA Fremantle, this project responds to the social and built environments of this radically changing part of Fremantle.
